Surface Preparation

General

Elite Low Sheen can be used effectively on walls, doors, jambs, and shelves. Surfaces to be painted with Elite Low Sheen must be clean, sound, and properly sealed.

Unpainted surfaces: Drywall must be sealed with a good acrylic wall sealer. Bare wood substrates must be properly filled, primed, sanded, and dusted.

Repaint work: All surfaces to be painted must be clean and free of all dirt, dust, loose or flaking paint, grease, or any other foreign matter.

Application

Elite Low Sheen may be applied with a brush, roller, or airless spray equipment. Clean equipment with water immediately after use.

Thinning

Elite Low Sheen is designed to be applied at full consistency; however, small amounts of clean tap water may be used to thin to the desired working consistency.

CAUTIONS

Do not apply when temperature is below 50 degrees F. Do not apply to any exterior surface when rain is expected within 24 hours. Keep from freezing. Keep all unused material in tightly closed containers. Keep away from children. Do not take internally.
