Surface Preparation

Foamlife Primer is to be used on urethane foam roofs. Surfaces to be coated with Foamlife Primer must be sound, clean, completely cured, chalk-free, and dry. Do not apply Foamlife products to foams which contain silicones.

Application

Foamlife may be sprayed or rolled. Apply Foamlife Primer at the rate of approximately 75 square feet per gallon to ensure adequate protection of the foam. Clean equipment with water immediately after use.

Thinning

No thinning is required or recommended.

CAUTIONS

Do not apply when temperature is below 50 degrees F. Do not apply to any exterior surface when rain is expected within 24 hours. Keep from freezing. Keep all unused material in tightly closed containers. Keep away from children. Do not take internally.
